Trainers' Safety Checklist - Pre-Training (2023/24 Racing Season)

Attached is the "Trainers' Safety Checklist for use when sending Horses for Pre-Training" form for completion prior to the 2023-24 racing season (**Checklist**).

The objective of the Checklist is to ensure that all reasonable steps are taken to ensure the safety of pre-training operations used by licensed trainers for pre-training and other education of racehorses.

The Checklist is provided pursuant to LR 26, and it is a requirement under the Rules that each trainer complete the Checklist as and when required (see below).

What do I need to do?

The Checklist is required to be filled out for all pre-training operations (Pre-Trainers) to which you currently have horses, or intend to send horses for the 2023-2024 racing season. As you will note from the Checklist:

- (a) where a Pre-Trainer is licensed by Racing Victoria, you are only required to record your details, the details of the Pre-Trainer and the fact that you have confirmed the Pre-Trainer is licensed (see Part A of the form);
- (b) where a Pre-Trainer is **not** licensed by Racing Victoria, you are required to:
 - i. take the steps set out in the Checklist to confirm that the Pre-Trainer has the Personal Protective Equipment and Riding Equipment, and tick the relevant boxes; and
 - ii. sign the form at Part B, and have the Pre-Trainer also sign the form at Part B.

Racing Victoria appreciates that there may be some administrative time required to complete the Checklist for each Pre-Trainer. Completed forms must be kept on your files and will be required for production by the Stewards or Racing Victoria upon request.

Audit and Review of Checklist Forms and Records

As part of our trainer safety programs, Racing Victoria conducts random and targeted audits of licensed trainers to review, amongst other things, safety processes. Where audits take place in the future, we may require you to produce your completed Checklists in respect of Pre-Trainers to whom you have sent horses.

Failure to produce such records upon request may lead to, amongst other things, action being taken under the Rules of Racing or to the imposition of further conditions upon your licence.

Under LR 26(1), before a trainer sends a horse that is recorded on the trainer's stable return to another person for pre-training and/or education (**Pre-Trainer**), the trainer must make reasonable inquiry of the Pre-Trainer to satisfy himself or herself that the Pre-Trainer will conduct pre-training and/or education of the horse in a safe manner with equipment and gear that is specified in, and accordance with, the Rules of Racing.

LR 26(2) provides that a trainer will have complied with LR 26(1) by recording on the form prescribed by Racing Victoria the checklist of equipment and gear required by the Rules to be used by the Pre-Trainer and that the form has been completed with the written acknowledgment and acceptance of the Pre-Trainer.

A trainer is required to complete this form when sending a horse to a Pre-Trainer. Where a trainer regularly sends horses that are recorded on the trainer's stable return to a Pre-Trainer for pre-training and/or education, the trainer's obligation to make reasonable inquiry under LR 26(1) will be satisfied when this form is completed in respect of the relevant Pre-Trainer once in a 12-month period.

Before a trainer sends a horse to a Pre-Trainer who is licensed by Racing Victoria at the time the horse is to be sent to the Pre-Trainer, the trainer is to complete Part A of this form.

Before a trainer sends a horse to a Pre-Trainer who is NOT licensed by Racing Victoria at the time the horse is to be sent to the Pre-Trainer, the trainer is to complete Part B of this form.

The Trainer must tick each box below to confirm that he/she has confirmed that the Pre-Trainer has the relevant equipment (including ensuring that the equipment is in the working order as described below), and both the Trainer and Pre-Trainer must sign below.
