<u>Charge 1</u> Breach of AR 175A

Any person bound by these Rules who either within a racecourse or elsewhere in the opinion of the Committee of the Club or the Stewards has been guilty of conduct prejudicial to the image, or interests, or welfare of racing may be

penalised.

Charge 2 Breach of AR 175(a)

The Committee of any Club or the Stewards may penalise: Any person who, in their opinion, has been guilty of any dishonest, corrupt, fraudulent, improper or

dishonourable action or practice in connection with racing.

<u>Plea</u> Charge 1 – No plea entered.

Charge 2 - No plea entered.

<u>Decision</u> Convicted on charges 1 and 2.

Charge 1 - Penalty on Charge 1 - warned off for 5 years. Charge 2 - Penalty on Charge 2 - warned off for 5 years.

Penalties to be served concurrently.

The Board is of the view that Mr Dight should be warned off for a period of five years.
